Supporting children to improve their basic skills in Numeracy and Literacy including work on Phonics where appropriate.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The school evaluated the impact on each pupil at the end of each term. Evaluation focused on progress in Reading, Writing and Maths. We also looked at how pupils' self-confidence developed as a consequence of the intervention.

All children made expected or better progress.

At the end of Year 1 100% of children achieved the standard regarding the Phonics Check.

At the end of Key Stage One children in receipt of the Pupil Premium performed better than the rest in Reading, Writing and Mathematics at Level 3.

100% of pupils in receipt of pupil premium achieved Level 2+ in Reading, Writing and Maths at the end of Key Stage 1.

There were seven children in receipt of the Pupil Premium in Year 6. 100% made expected progress or better in Reading, Writing and Maths. Four children exceeded expected progress in Reading, three in Writing and three in Maths.

Pupils in receipt of the Pupil Premium performed better than the rest at Level 4B+ (secondary ready).

One child in receipt of the Pupil Premium was absent for the Reading and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling Test; the rest all achieved Level 4+ in these areas. All achieved Level 4+ in the Maths test.

With regard to Level 5+ six children achieved this in Reading (one child absent); three in Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (one child absent), one of whom achieved Level 6; two in Writing and two in Maths.
