STAFFING

I am pleased to announce that Mrs Bayes was recently appointed as Deputy Headteacher with effect from the start of this term. We also welcome three new members of staff: Mrs Susan Brighty, Mrs Siobhan Cotter and Miss Helen Mills as Teaching Assistants. Mrs Brighty will also be providing additional office support on Tuesdays, working alongside Mrs Clarke. Congratulations to Teaching Assistant Miss Buckland-Smith who recently married and is now Mrs Kent. Also, congratulations to Catering Assistant Donna Brand who married during the Easter holiday and is now Mrs Scrivener. Our best wishes go to Mrs Nell and her husband on the safe arrival of their beautiful baby girl, Lily. We wish them every happiness for the future.

COMPUTING

Mrs McBeath and Mrs Naughton have worked closely with our staff and the county's ICT Service to make further improvements to the technology provision at Lionel Walden. The Interactive Whiteboards (Smartboards) in three of our classrooms have been replaced with more up-to-date models. We have recently updated our technological equipment (including the purchase of further laptops, iPads and programmable devices) in line with the new National Curriculum requirements and have purchased secure storage units to ensure they are locked away when not in use. These improvements will ensure that all children are engaged in their learning and that their knowledge is extended.

Nowadays, children spend much more of their time 'online' and using technology, both at home and at school. It is apparent that they are not always aware of the potential risks or how to handle certain issues. We as teachers and as parents have a duty to ensure our children are safe. In school, we have secure filters in place but it is still vital that we alert children to possible dangers. With this in mind, we are planning an 'E-safety Week' in June. As part of this, we have the ICT Service team coming into our

school to run e-safety information sessions for parents at 2.00 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Tuesday, 9th June. Further details will follow. Class teachers will be supporting the children in activities to help them learn how to use technology responsibly and with increased awareness.



KEY STAGE 2 TESTS

These will take place between Monday, 11th May and Friday, 15th May. It is important that all Year 6 children attend school during the week of these tests.

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SPORTS AFTERNOON

Come and join us on <u>Wednesday, 20th May</u> at 1.15 p.m., <u>weather permitting</u>. All pupils will remain with their

classes throughout the afternoon and must be collected from their classrooms at the end. Please ensure they have a sunhat with them. Water will be supplied for the children. Drinks will be available for parents and spectators. We ask that all parents refrain from sitting at the starting/finishing lines.

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SCHOOL UNIFORM

We shall continue to reinforce our expectations regarding the wearing of school uniform and encourage children to take pride in their appearance. The school colours are navy/grey skirts/pinafore dresses or grey/black trousers with white shirts. PE kit should consist of a <u>plain</u> white t-shirt with navy or white shorts and plimsolls. Strappy, colourful tops are not suitable. Jewellery should not be worn, except for <u>small stud earrings</u> for pierced ears. Earrings are <u>not</u> to be worn during PE/swimming lessons and children must be able to take them out themselves. If they cannot do this, they should not wear earrings on the days that they have PE/swimming. Thank you in advance for your support and co-operation with this. Please could you ensure that your <u>child's clothing is named</u>, particularly sweatshirts, cardigans and coats. With the arrival of warmer weather, if children leave their sweatshirts lying around, we can then return them to their owner.

POINTS TO REMEMBER

- \Rightarrow All school uniform/items of clothing must be <u>clearly labelled</u> with your child's name.
- ⇒ School letters—please check, <u>on a daily basis</u>, your child's bag.
- ⇒ Health & Safety issues—please use the pedestrian access at all times—the vehicular access/staff car park should not be used. Bicycles/scooters must not be ridden on the school premises by anyone including children.
- ⇒ Please adhere to the parking restrictions outside the school and give consideration to local residents.
- \Rightarrow We are a <u>no-smoking</u> premises.
- \Rightarrow Please note that dogs should not be brought onto the school premises.

TERM TIME HOLIDAYS

Changes to the law, which came into force on 1st September, 2013, mean that schools no longer have the discretion to grant 10 days of authorised leave/absence to pupils each year. The new rules state that Headteachers "may <u>not</u> grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances". Family holidays do <u>not</u> fall into the category of 'exceptional circumstances'.
