
Our Playleaders (Year 6 pupils) will continue to lead and encourage pupils to participate in a varied programme of lunchtime activities. Our four 'Sports Crew' pupils will continue their role during Healthy Week, in assisting with the organisation of sporting events.

Sports coaches, provided by Improve It (formerly Witchford Sports Partnership), will be teaching Dance sessions to Class 4 this term. Intra-school competitions will be held for different sporting activities.

Molly Dancing will be taking place with Year 5 on Monday afternoons. This will be led by Gordon Philips, from the Ouse Washes Molly Dancers, who will teach specific dances and recount stories of the local area. Swimming sessions also continue this term, with Years 5 and 6 before half-term and Years 3 and 4 after half-term.

### SCIENCE WEEK

Science Week is 13th to 17th March. Once again, a range of visitors will be in school including Mad Science, the Raptor Centre, Waterbeach Waste Education. Fossils Galore (based in March) and Lion Learners. Some classes will be visiting local secondary schools where they will participate in various Science lessons. As in previous years, each class will be experiencing a range of exciting experiments and activities. The school is having a non-uniform day on Friday, 24th March. Further details will follow after half term.



## TERM TIME HOLIDAYS - PLEASE AVOID THEM

Changes to the law, which came into force on 1st September, 2013, mean that schools no longer have the discretion to grant 10 days of authorised leave/absence to pupils each year. The new rules state that Headteachers "may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances". Family holidays and days out do not fall into the category of 'exceptional circumstances'. All children need to be present in school to achieve their full potential. The Education Welfare Officer will be monitoring attendance more closely.

### SCHOOL UNIFORM

We would greatly appreciate everyone adhering to the recommended school uniform. The school uniform consists of navy or grey skirt, or pinafore dress, or grey or black trousers with a white shirt with a navy sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan. No 'hoodies', please. Black shoes are preferred - sports shoes should be worn for outdoor PE/games. PE kit should consist of a plain white t-shirt with navy or white shorts. **PLEASE ENSURE YOUR CHILD'S CLOTHING IS LABELLED CLEARLY WITH THEIR NAME.** Jewellery should not be worn, except for small, stud earrings, if essential, for pierced ears. Please note that no earrings are to be worn for any PE or swimming lesson - children must be able to remove them themselves prior to the lesson or have them removed at home on days when PE is timetabled. Nail varnish should not be worn. Mrs. Clarke, in the School Office, has sweatshirts and coats, with the school logo, for sale which are hard-wearing and reasonably priced.
