# Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2021/2022

Regardless of their ability, or prior attainment, those children eligible for Pupil Premium, receive additional support within their classroom.

The primary support for pupils includes the development of skills in Literacy and Numeracy including focused work on phonics/reading where appropriate and participation in a spelling intervention programme. Pupils also receive support in other subject areas to ensure they are able to apply the development of these skills across the whole curriculum.

### Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The impact of Pupil Premium funding and the details of additional support provided by the school will be evaluated half-termly.

Evaluation will focus on individuals' progress in Reading, Writing and Mathematics.

The impact on pupils' confidence, self-esteem, well-being and attitude to learning will be reviewed.

The school's Governing Body will receive progress reports at each meeting. There is a named governor (Mr Andrew Naughton) with responsibility for monitoring the progress of Pupil Premium children. This includes monitoring visits (with Learning Walks) and meetings with the Headteacher/Senior Leadership Team, discussions with pupils and the outcomes and impact of regular scrutiny of work books.
