OUR NEXT SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2014 AND BEYOND

The School Development Plan is the document that drives the strategic work to develop and improve the school. The plan gives everyone in the school community a clear vision and sense of purpose for improving the school.

We have six key, 'headline' targets, along with proposed success criteria and key actions for each target. The key targets have been reached by gathering information from a variety of sources. These will include external evaluations of our work by the Local Authority, alongside our own extensive and detailed self-evaluation processes – our data analysis, staff appraisal processes, lesson observations, pupil progress meetings and feedback from children and parents. The targets draw on discussions Governors have had in our various Full Governing Body and Committee meetings. They also reflect the national agenda of education reform. In addition, targets and action plans give Governors the opportunity to monitor and evaluate the work of the school to develop, improve and raise standards. We build into the action plans monitoring and evaluation activities – these activities will include the work of Governors through committees and link Governor visits.

The six headline targets are listed below:

- * Raising the proportion of our teaching that is 'outstanding'
- * Developing our ICT Curriculum
- * Introducing the new National Curriculum from September 2014
- * Improving outcomes for our children
- * Teaching School Activities
- * Premises Development

Success criteria and key actions for each target will be posted on our website within the next fortnight.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

At the start of the new school year, we will once again be reinforcing our expectations regarding the wearing of school uniform. The school colours are navy/grey skirts/pinafore dresses or grey/black trousers with white shirts. PE kit should consist of a <u>plain</u> white t-shirt with navy or white shorts and plimsolls. Strappy, colourful tops are not suitable. Jewellery should not be worn, except for <u>small studearrings</u> for pierced ears. Earrings are not to be worn during PE/swimming lessons and children must be able to take them out themselves. If they cannot do this, they should not wear earrings on the days that they have PE/swimming. Thank you in advance for your support and co-operation with this.

PARENTS' EVENING

This term's Parents' Evening is aimed at giving you a brief overview of how your child has settled back into school. Children's books will be located outside the classroom, in named batches, for parents to look through prior to seeing their child's class teacher. These books should be brought into the classroom and returned to the teacher during the consultation. Children should not attend this evening which will take place on Wednesday, 22nd October between 3.30 p.m. and 5.00 p.m. and between 5.30 p.m. and 7.30 p.m. Included in the books for parents to view will be your child's 'Writing Progress' book. The work in this book will be built on throughout your child's time in school demonstrating progress made each term. This work is completed independently and is left unmarked.

- ⇒ New parking restrictions have come into force outside the school.
- \Rightarrow We are a <u>no-smoking</u> premises.
- \Rightarrow Please note that dogs should not be brought onto the school premises.

RECEPTION CHILDREN

Our Reception children have started school and it has been good to see them getting used to their classroom. In preparation for full time attendance, they are staying at school this week for lunch until 1.00 p.m. Initially, the children who stay, eat in the hall and are helped by children

DINNER MONEY/UNIVERSAL FREE SCHOOL MEALS

From September, all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children are eligible for a free school meal every day funded by a Government initiative. We have increased staffing and invested in new kitchen equipment to enable us to meet the increased demand and so far, the response has been encouraging. We would like to welcome Mrs. Claire Tibbitts who has joined our catering team. For Years 3, 4, 5 and 6, we are pleased to have been able to keep the cost of a meal at £2.00. All dinners should be paid for in advance or on the day. Please look out for special promotional days.





PARENTAL HELP

SWIMMING

ADMINISTERING OF MEDICINES IN SCHOOL

PUPIL ILLNESS - DIARRHOEA AND VOMITING

Parents are reminded that in incidents of diarrhoea and vomiting, children should be kept away from school for 48 hours after the last bout of illness. This is to prevent infections from spreading.
