
I am very pleased to inform you that we have successfully recruited two new teachers to join the staff here at Lionel Walden from September.

NATIONAL TESTS - KEY STAGES 1 AND 2

National curriculum tests (SATs) have been reinstated again this year and are taking place in May for all pupils in Years 2 and 6. The tests will provide information about how your child is progressing, compared to children the same age nationally.

Key Stage 1 Tests - Year 2 Pupils

The tests this year are:-

- English reading (two papers)
- Mathematics (two papers)

Although your child will take these tests in May, most pupils will be unaware they are taking them as they will be incorporated into everyday classroom practice and there are no firm time restrictions. Teacher assessment is used to report children's attainment and progress to parents. Teachers will use the Key Stage 1 test results to help them reach an overall judgement of the standards children have reached in English reading, English writing and Mathematics. You will also receive a teacher assessment judgement for Science. You will receive your child's results with their school report at the end of the Summer Term.

It is important that children do not become concerned or anxious about these tests. In school, staff do their utmost to ensure pupils remain calm and unfazed by the tests by completing them as part of normal classroom practice. We kindly ask that, as parents, you refrain from drawing attention to them and be assured that our staff will use their experience and knowledge to support your children in the best way possible.

Key Stage 2 Tests - Year 6 Pupils

This year the tests are:-

- English grammar, punctuation and spelling (two papers)
- English reading (one paper)
- Mathematics (three papers)

You will receive test results for your child in English reading, English grammar, punctuation and spelling and Mathematics. There is no test for English writing; this will be reported using teacher assessment. You will also receive a separate teacher assessment judgement for Science.

The Key Stage 2 tests will take place between Monday 9th May and Thursday 12th May. It is important that all Year 6 children attend school during the week of these tests.

Our staff and children have worked extremely hard to cover the specified content of the National Curriculum in order to prepare pupils for moving on to secondary school. It is important that pupils remain calm and relaxed during SATs week and arrive at school on time. They are familiar with the procedures and should not be concerned. We appreciate your help and support with this.

SPORTS AFTERNOON

We are very much looking forward to welcoming you to our Sports Afternoon on <u>Wednesday 25th May</u>, starting promptly at 1.15 p.m., <u>weather permitting</u>. All pupils will remain with their classes throughout the afternoon and must be collected from their classrooms at the end. Please ensure they have a sunhat with them. Please ensure your child remembers to bring their water bottle to school - these will be refilled before they go out onto the field. Drinks will be available for parent spectators. We ask that all parents sit well away from the starting and finish lines. Have an enjoyable afternoon!



READING CAFÉ FOR YEAR 2

We are very pleased to be able to invite our Year 2 parents into school this term to take part in a short series of Reading Café events. Parents will be able to share in their children's reading and complete activities with them based around a specific book. The children will also be baking refreshments which will be enjoyed by all at the sessions. This is funded by the Opportunity Area programme.

P.E. LESSONS

We are continuing to ask that children come into school wearing their P.E. kits on the days they have P.E. - a plain, white t-shirt with black or navy shorts, please. They should also wear their school sweatshirt, or another plain top, on cooler days.

No jewellery should be worn in school except for small stud earrings. These <u>must</u> be removed independently by your child before <u>P.E. and swimming lessons</u>. Alternatively, they should be removed before coming to school.

Thank you for adhering to this safety requirement.

ADMINISTERING OF MEDICINES IN SCHOOL

You are reminded that in the event of your child needing medicines in school time, a consent form <u>MUST</u> be completed by you before any medication can be administered by school staff. Forms can be obtained from the School Office. Children must <u>not</u> retain medicines in their school bags.

PUPIL ILLNESS

Parents are reminded that in incidents of diarrhoea and vomiting, children should be kept away from school for 48 hours after the last bout of illness. This is to prevent infections from spreading.

I'f a child has symptoms of Covid, or has tested positive, they should remain at home for three days and until their temperature has returned to normal. They can then return to school if they are well enough.

SCHOOL RECORDS

Please inform the School Office of any changes regarding your child/children's records. This is particularly important in respect of <u>mobile telephone numbers</u> and any changes to medical details - we may need to contact you in an emergency! This also applies to email addresses - please ensure we have your most up-to-date address, particularly as we now communicate by email.



ATTENDANCE/TERM TIME HOLIDAYS

It is extremely important that your child attends school, particularly as we have all experienced much disruption during the pandemic. Please notify the School Office, either by email or telephone, on the first day of absence and on subsequent days. If there is anything we can do to support you through periods of longer term absence, please let us know.

Please note that Headteachers may <u>not</u> grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Family holidays do <u>not</u> fall into the category of 'exceptional circumstances'. All children need to be present in school consistently to achieve their full potential.

ROAD CROSSING PATROL/PARKING OUTSIDE SCHOOL

We are very pleased to have a Road Crossing Patrol Officer, Mrs Overall, on duty before and after school. On the occasions when the crossing is unmanned, due to illness or unforeseen circumstances, we shall endeavour to alert parents by email at our earliest opportunity.

Parents are politely reminded to park away from the yellow zig zag lines outside school. This applies before and after school and when collecting children at other times.

In addition, we ask that you park with consideration for our neighbours and residents of Child's Lane and Wood Street.

The safety of everyone is paramount. Thank you for your cooperation.

SCHOOL UNIFORM/LOST PROPERTY

We would greatly appreciate everyone adhering to the recommended school uniform. The school uniform consists of navy or grey skirt, or pinafore dress, or grey or black trousers with a white shirt with a navy sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan. During the Summer Term, blue and white gingham school dresses are also popular. No 'hoodies', please. Black shoes are preferred - sports shoes should be worn for outdoor PE/games. PE kit should consist of a plain, white t-shirt with navy or black shorts. School sweatshirts, cardigans and coats, with the school logo, can be ordered online. PLEASE ENSURE EACH ITEM OF YOUR CHILD'S CLOTHING IS CLEARLY LABELLED WITH THEIR NAME - WE CAN THEN ENSURE 'LOST' ITEMS MAKE THEIR WAY BACK TO THE CORRECT CHILD.

Jewellery should not be worn, except for small, stud earrings, if essential, for pierced ears. Please note that <u>no earrings are to be worn for any PE or swimming lesson</u> – children must be able to remove them independently prior to the lesson or have them removed at home on days when PE is timetabled. Nail varnish and false nails should not be worn.
